

Welcome to this term's newsletter.

Dear Parents / Carers.

During the spring term, we will be following two themes: What is it like to live in Kenya? and Pirates and Mermaids. In the first half term, we will be investigating what it is like to live in Kenya and comparing this to where we live. In Art we will be learning to use different techniques including marbling and silhouettes and in Design and Technology we will be creating our own safari jeeps.



After the half term break, we will be learning about the lives of famous pirates including Blackbeard and Ann Bonny. In Music, we will listen to, and perform a range of 'sea-shanties' and in Geography we will be practicing our map skills by creating our very own treasure maps!

Reading:

Thank you for all your support when hearing your child read. We would be grate-ful if you could listen to them read, ask them questions about the book and help

them with any problems they have. Please sign their diary every time you hear your child read. Children receive class do jo rewards for reading their books.

PE

Children need to have their PE kit in school every day. They need tee-shirt, shorts and trainers for indoor sessions and sweatshirts, jogging trousers or leggings for outdoor sessions. All children **must have** their earrings removed on their PE day. Please bear in mind that we are not able to remove them or to cover them with plasters.

Homework:

Year 2 children will receive spellings and Maths homework on a Tuesday, these need to be returned to school by the following Monday.

If I have not got homework there are lots of things I can do:

Answer questions orally about my reading book

Practise number bonds to 20 e.g. 14 + 3 = 17 so 17 - 3 = 14

Practise number compliments to 20 e.g. 15+5=20 so 20-5=15

Read and write numbers to 100 in words.

Learn to identify shapes e.g. triangle, square, oblong, circle, pentagon, hexagon, octagon and talk about their properties e.g. numbers of sides, corners, right angles

The expectation for the end of Year 2 is for all children to know their 2's, 5.s and 10's times tables in and out of order and the corresponding division facts.
